




Creating God Your Fingers Trace





Words of Institution


With these words, the pastor consecrates the elements for Holy Communion.

The Sensory Room is a safe place for those with differences, such as ADHD or autism, who cannot remain seated for long periods of time quietly or silently, to participate in worship without disturbing those around them. With comfortable seating, adjustable lighting and sound, and a large picture window, this room is a welcome extension of the worship space.

Prayer Stations are located along the rear wall of the Sanctuary. You are invited to use these stations for personal reflection and prayer before or after worship, or after receiving communion. You are also invited to light a candle – the flame a symbol of the light of Christ, sustained in our hearts even as we leave this space.

Listening and Visual Aid Devices are available during worship services for those with hearing and sight impairments. If you would like to use this equipment, ask an usher. There are large-print Scripture lessons available on the counter in the Narthex. Please feel free to pick up copies.
