Our worship this morning is set apart from other Sundays as the traditional proclamation of the Word through spoken sermon is offered through music, by or on behalf of the gathered community. The pattern of the lessons follows the ancient Great "O" Antiphons, a series of seven short verses, each an ascription for Christ from language of the Old Testament. In the original Latin when read in reverse the ascriptions form the acrostic *ERO CRAS – I shall be with you tomorrow*.

Each antiphon is chanted first by the Choir, followed by a complementary Scripture lesson with a musical response.

Wisdom of Solomon 7:21b-8:1

There is in her a spirit that is intelligent, holy, unique, manifold, subtle, mobile, clear, unpolluted, distinct, invulnerable, loving the good, keen, irresistible, beneficent, humane, steadfast, sure, free from anxiety, all-powerful, overseeing all, and penetrating through all spirits that are intelligent, pure, and altogether subtle. For wisdom is more mobile than any motion; because of her pureness she pervades and penetrates all things. For she is a breath of the power of God, and a pure emanation of the glory of the Almighty; therefore nothing defiled gains entrance into her. 
Hark, I Hear the Harps Resounding

"Comfort, comfort now my people; tell of peace!" So says our God. Comfort those who toil and tremble, mourning under sorrow's load.


